Gloucester County's Geographic Information Systems (GIS) Department has launched a new ESRI ArcGIS website. The website offers improved functionality for searching County properties and finding adjoining parcels. It includes easier zooming and panning, as well as layers that provide information on everything from County limits and magisterial districts to topography and floodplains. The website also provides basic real estate assessment data from the most current assessment cycle. The address for the new site is http://gloucestergis.timmons.com. This website is viewable on both traditional computers and mobile devices, taking advantage of responsive design to match the application with the screen size. The site also includes search capabilities by address, street, owner, subdivision, parcel or magisterial district. Citizens or businesses will have the ability to download search data and print the map to a pdf document.

This launch of the new GIS website is the first of two phases. The second phase of the project will add more data to the parcels from the real estate assessment system as well as information from the tax system. Phase 2 will also integrate high resolution photography from the County's Pictometry system with the website. The goal is to make the Gloucester County GIS website a one-stop-shop for any County data related to a parcel.

"In the past year, we've made some exciting changes in the GIS office. Obtaining an E911/PSAP grant, with the help of Timmons Group, has made these changes possible. After having our data converted into the industry standard GIS software, ArcGIS, the grant also provided for a much needed upgrade to our new, more user friendly GIS website.
