New County Administrator Hired for Gloucester

The Gloucester County Board of Supervisors has approved the hiring of Mr. Brent Fedors to serve as Gloucester County Administrator. Fedors will report for his first day on Monday, January 4, 2016.

Mr. Fedors, a native of Gloucester, has most recently been employed as Vice President and Business Line Leader for the Facilities Management division of AECOM, a global infrastructure services firm. As head of the Facilities Management business line, Fedors was responsible for client relationship management, service delivery excellence, and business strategy development while leading a team of more than 350 personnel. Prior to joining AECOM, he served as Senior Vice President and Executive Director with Jones Lang LaSalle (JLL), a global real estate services firm, and was responsible for a product line team of over 600 personnel. Fedors brings fifteen years of experience in real estate and facilities management, integrated service solutions and business leadership to Gloucester County. He also serves as an Advisory Board Member and Facility Management Curriculum Chair for the Georgia Tech School of Building Construction.

As a native of Gloucester, Fedors attended Gloucester County Public Schools and graduated from Essex High School in Tappahannock. He received his Bachelor's Degree from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University with a major in Hospitality and Tourism Management (now part of the Pamplin College of Business).
