

Beaverdam Park...a quick tour.



The lake has been in existence since 1990 and was constructed to provide drinking water for Gloucester County.

Beaverdam Park surrounds a 635 acre reservoir owned by Gloucester County.



The lake and surrounding area also provide recreational areas for Fishing, hiking and picnicking.



Trails—If you enjoy horseback riding, mountain biking, hiking or just walking your dog the Multi-purpose trail is for you. There are 9.5 miles of trails along the reservoir and in beautiful woodlands. No fee, just sign the trail log.

Animals such as deer, raccoons, bald eagles and beavers can be viewed from this widely used scenic lakeside trail.

15 miles of multi-purpose trail link the Fary's Mill Road (route 606) park entrance to the Roaring Springs Road (route 616) main park entrance.



This trail, accessible by bike, horse or foot, is a constant maintenance project. Park volunteers are needed to help...call 804-693-2107 or email us if you are interested.



The 635 acre lake has an average depth of 12 feet and a maximum depth of 27 feet. There are 11 fish attractors, tree tops chained to stumps, located throughout the lake.



The lake contains flats, drop-offs, rip rap and standing timber. The bottom is relatively clean and the water remains clear to slightly stained.





A boat ramp for private boats is available for a \$6 daily launch fee or you may purchase an annual pass for unlimited launches.

Rental boats and canoes are available at the Ranger Station for a daily fee. Paddles and life jackets are included, electric motors and batteries may be rented for an additional fee.



The park offers picnicking in a variety of settings. Picnic tables are placed throughout the park in scenic locations and are available on a first come first served basis or for a small fee can be reserved.

At the main entrance a picnic shelter with tables and electricity can be reserved and is in the proximity of the playground, volleyball court and horseshoe pit.



Rent the Whitcomb Lodge picnics or meetings and has electricity, heat, a/c, patio, restrooms, tables, chairs, tv/vcr and serving kitchen.

Drinks, snacks, rentals, park information and maps are available at the ranger station.



The parking lot is centrally located with access to lodge, picnic shelter, trail and boat ramp. Beaverdam Park also has handicapped accessible restrooms and water fountains.

The amphitheater, a wonderful outdoor environment, is used by the park for nature shows and educational programs. It is also open to the public for their enjoyment.



Looking for a great way to spend the day? Come to Beaverdam and rent a canoe. Canoes are available at the Ranger Station.

Fishing, Hiking, Biking, Horseback Riding, Nature Walks, Playgrounds, Rentals, Restrooms, Snacks and More. Beaverdam Park has it all! Come visit soon!

The canoes will hold 2 adults and 2 small children. Each canoe comes with life jackets and paddles. The lake offers a variety of scenery that can be enjoyed from the canoe.



For fishing, watching nature or just spending a day on the lake a rental boat is a great way to relax. Rental boats will easily accommodate 3 people or 385 pounds.

Rental boats are available on a first come first served basis 7 days a week at the Ranger Station.



Pedal boats are also available and will accommodate 2 adults. They are a great way to get exercise, sun and enjoy the scenery while floating around the lake.
